## Term 1: The Latin Verb

Introduction to Latin

Identifying parts of speech (concentrating on nouns and verbs)

Principal parts of the verb (English & Latin)

Tense, person and number

1<sup>st</sup> conjugation present indicative active

Recognition of and formation of 1<sup>st</sup> conjugation present indicative active



## Term 2: The Latin Noun

1<sup>st</sup> declension all cases but Nominative and Accusative in detail

Genitive, Dative and Ablative as appropriate

Identify and explore role of the noun in English (pronouns etc)

1<sup>st</sup> declension Latin noun endings learnt through games

Translation of nominative, accusative and genitive with other cases as extension



## Term 3: Translating Nouns and Verbs together

Revision of present indicative active and full range of knowledge about verbs

Combination with nouns to make simple clauses

Combination of nouns and verbs to make more complex sentences

Subject/verb agreement

Syntax (overview: English/Latin/Yoda)

# Level 2

## Term 1: Learn the verb To Be + Revise Gen/Dat/Abl

Present tense verb “to be”  
Revision of the genitive case  
Ablative of the instrument  
Prepositions with accusative and ablative  
English prefixes from Latin prepositions



## Term 2: Revise 1<sup>st</sup> Declension Latin Noun + Learn The Passive Voice

1<sup>st</sup> declension revise cases  
Genitive, dative and ablative in detail  
Understanding the meaning of Voice  
Identifying active vs passive  
Formation of the present indicative passive  
Ablative of the agent



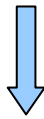
## Term 3: Introduce 2<sup>nd</sup> Declension Latin Nouns + Introduce the imperfect

Imperfect active of to be in Latin

# Level 3

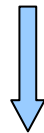
## Term 1: The Future Tense in Latin + 2<sup>nd</sup> Declension neuter nouns

Revise tenses in English  
Formation of the future indicative active in Latin (same 6 hand signs)  
Formation of the future indicative passive as extension activity  
Future indicative active of the verb to be in Latin  
2<sup>nd</sup> Declension neuter nouns in Latin



## Term 2: 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> declension adjectives + 3<sup>rd</sup> conjugation verbs and the verb "posse"

Introduction to adjectives in English and general recap of parts of speech  
1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> declension adjective endings in Latin  
Agreement and attributive vs substantive adjective  
3<sup>rd</sup> conjugation verbs in the indicative active and passive present, imperfect and future.  
Posse present, imperfect and perfect indicative active



## Term 3: 3<sup>rd</sup> conjugation i-stem verbs and 4<sup>th</sup> Conjugation verbs and the relative pronoun

Present, imperfect and future tense, indicative active and passive for 3<sup>rd</sup> conjugation and 4<sup>th</sup> conjugation  
Relative pronoun in English  
Declension of Qui, quae, quod  
Demonstrative adjectives (hic and ille)
